

# PUBLIX COVID-19 VACCINE INFORMATION

Governor DeSantis recently announced a partnership with Publix Supermarkets to establish COVID-19 vaccination sites, which now includes many locations in our community. Here is the latest information on this program:

- Vaccines will be administered at select Publix locations by appointment only.
- You must be 65 or older to receive the vaccine.
- Appointments can be made by visiting [www.publix.com/covidvaccine](http://www.publix.com/covidvaccine).
- Eligible customers can access COVID-19 vaccine appointment availability beginning Wednesday, January 20.
- The first vaccines will be administered beginning on Thursday, January 21.

## **Palm Beach County**
